hours that the premises are open to the public. The images recorded by the CCTV system shall be retained in unedited form for a period of not less than 28 days.

A notice or notices shall be displayed in and at the entrance to the premises where they can be clearly seen and read and shall indicate that it is unlawful for persons under 18 to purchase alcohol or for any person to purchase alcohol on behalf of a person under 18 years of age.

All staff shall receive training to prevent under age sales of alcohol. All staff receive regular refresher training to prevent underage sales. Training to be documented. Training records to be presented to the Police or an authorised officer upon request.

All persons who appear to be under the age of 25 years shall be required to produce proof of age by way of the following:

- A recognised proof of age card accredited under the British Retail Consortiums Proof of Age Standards Scheme (PASS)
- Photo driving licence
- Passport
- Citizen card supported by the Home Office
- Official ID card issued by HM Forces or European Union Member State bearing a photograph and birth date of the holder

A refusals book shall be maintained to record all challenges and refused sales to persons who cannot comply with the above conditions.

Conditions Imposed after a Review of the Premise Licence.

~~The premise shall operate a last entry policy. On a Thursday and Sunday last entry or re-entry into the premise shall be 01.00hours and on a Friday and Saturday the last entry or re-entry into the premise shall be 02.00 hours. This effectively means that on those days there will be no entry or re-entry into the premise in the hour before the last permitted sale of alcohol.~~

~~When the premises are open for the purpose of carrying out licensable activities after 2300 hours on a Friday there must be at least one SIA registered door supervisor on duty from 2300 hours until the close of business.~~

~~hours on a Saturday there must be at least two SIA registered door supervisors on duty from 2300 hours until the close of business.~~

~~The door supervisors shall carry out regular checks of the perimeter of the premise.~~

A record shall be kept on the premises by the DPS of every person employed on the premises as a door supervisor. The record shall contain the following details

- Name and address
- Date of birth
- His/her Security Industry Authority licence number
- The date and time he/she starts and finishes duty
- Each entry to be signed by the door supervisor

That entry shall be kept and available for inspection on demand by an Authorised Officer of the Council, the Security Industry Authority or the Police.

Each week the DPS will carry out a detailed risk assessment prior to opening the premises to ascertain whether additional door supervisors are required to ensure that the premises is operating safely in order to promote the licensing objective for the prevention of crime and disorder. The DPS will also take into account any advice provided by the Police on these occasions. The risk assessment will be written in a format and available to the Police or the Licensing authority if requested for a period of 3 Months

No customer shall be permitted to leave the premise (for the purpose of this condition the beer garden is included within the description of the premise) whilst in possession of a drinking vessel, open bottle or other container used for the purpose of consuming alcohol.
