### 1. **Purpose of Report**

1.1 To provide members with an update on NHS England's Transforming Care.

### 2. **Recommendations**

2.1 That the Communities and Wellbeing Overview and Scrutiny Committee considers the presentation from NHS England.

### 3. **Reasons for Recommendations and Background**

3.1 In 2016/17, this Committee received presentations from NHS England on 28<sup>th</sup> June 2016 and 7<sup>th</sup> February 2017. Meetings related to the "Consultation for the proposed redesign of learning disability and autistic spectrum disorder services in the North West." The proposed redesign of services had direct implications for Mersey Care Whalley (Formally Calderstones). NHS England's preferred option involved the removal of both medium and low secure services from the Calderstones site.

3.2 At the time, this committee opposed this option and instead supported option 2B, which involved some services (totalling 56 beds) remaining at Mersey Care Whalley. The Committee made the following resolutions:

(1) That the Committee recommends that Hyndburn Borough Council supports Option 2B as set out in the 'Consultation for the Proposed Redesign of Learning Disability and Autistic Spectrum Disorder Services in the North West';

(2) That the Committee's disappointment be noted in the consultation process and the lack of reflection of the true service provided by Mersey Care Whalley in the consultation;

(3) That it be noted that there was still a requirement for low secure care at Mersey Care Whalley; and

(4) That the Chair of the Committee, with the Support from the Overview and Scrutiny Officer, provides a full response to the consultation which expresses the views and concerns of the Committee.

3.3 The committee responded to the consultation as detailed above. After analysing all responses to the consultation, the decision was made to choose option 1: To move all low and medium secure services off the Mersey Care Whalley site.

3.4 NHS England have requested to come back to the Committee to provide an update, and will be presenting to the Committee.
