Further to the notice for a late license on the station arms pub, I and other people in the surrounding area disagree on this matter as it is in a built up area and in a residential area. The pub has been allowing people to drink until all hours for the past four years at least and on numerous occasions the police have been called out also the noise enforcement officer. The windows and door are left open and the noise can be heard in your own property even with the TV on and as late as 1.30 - 2.00 pm you can hear car doors slamming taxis banging on the door and people at the front of the property smoking and shouting loudly there is a car park at the rear that is never used and should be. on the 25th /02/2018 at about 10 -45 the police were called out, riot van, four cars and two police vans as there was 8 youths fighting outside off the pub, causing distress to local residents this happens on numerous occasions and has been reported on numerous occasions but nothing ever gets done. Also under age drinking and drug smoking on car park. This should all be looked into as it is getting out of hand.

This email is to register my objections to the application to extend the licensing/entertainment hours of the above establishment, being a resident living in the immediate vicinity of this establishment it raises great concerns to hear that they are looking to extend their hours having already experienced numerous problems in the past years. I believe the current entertainment licence is held till 12pm Friday and Saturday, yet the music has been played long after this time on numerous occasions in the past. Once the entertainment has stopped you can easily add a further hour to allow people to finish their drinks and then when people leave the premises they are hanging around talking or shouting, as has happened on lots of occasions.

During the Summer months when the weather is warm it is impossible to sleep with your windows open because the door to the establishment is left open and the noise makes it impossible to sleep. I have had to phone and complain about the noise in the past not to mention the times when disagreements/fights have broke out which have sometimes resulted in the Police being called. This is something that happened only last weekend (SUNDAY), when I was woke by my daughter who was panicking as she had gone to bathroom and seen all the flashing lights and heard voices. (Her bedroom is at the back of the house).

I would appreciate it if you could give me updated on this situation.

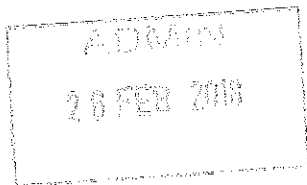
